With the Lloydminster area being known as a region of high populations of purebred cattle, we feel it's a perfect place to host a bull and heifer showcase before the spring sale season kicks off.

- The ORIGINAL PAPERS or ONLINE ASSOCIATION PRINTED PEDIGREES will be accepted and must be presented to Committee
- Pedigrees on cell phones WILL NOT be accepted, only a paper copy of pedigrees
- Animals that are not registered with the proper Association will NOT be allowed to show

ALL cattle entered must have a CCIA ear tag or be tagged with an approved RFID tag. All bulls over 12 months of age entered in the show must have a NOSE RING (NO HUMBUGS).

SPLIT CLASSES: Classes will be split at the discretion of the committee. The prize money will be equally split. The Committee will split the class after the registration check is completed. First and second placing from each split will compete for championship of the division.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are requested to familiarize themselves with the following Rules and Regulations governing Lloyd Ex Cattlemen's Call, as they will be strictly enforced.

1. VIOLATION OF RULES

All entries for exhibits, shows, sales and displays in the annual show sponsored by Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Assoc. are subject to the Rules and Regulations and any violation will subject exhibitors to such penalties the Management Committee may stipulate.

2. INTERPRETATION

The Board of Directors has the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or in connection with or incident to Lloyd Ex Cattlemen's Call. The Board of Directors has the right to amend or to add to these Rules and Regulations.

3. LIABILITY

The Board and Committee members, while taking every precaution, cannot hold themselves responsible for any damage to or loss of any exhibit.

- Every exhibitor shall be deemed to be in full charge of and responsible for their exhibit and the Association shall not be liable for any loss to any such exhibits, or for injury or damage thereto from the time that such exhibit commence to be transported to the premises of the Association until such exhibit is delivered there on and every exhibit on such premises shall be deemed to be at the risk of the exhibitor, except in the case of any exhibit being sold, when the same shall remain on such premises at risk of the purchaser at such sale, and in either case the Association shall not be liable for the loss of any such exhibit or for any injury or damage thereto, notwithstanding such loss, injury or damage arising through or by negligence of the Association of any of its officers, servants or agents.
- If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by neglect or wilful act of any person, firm or any corporation, or their agents, representative, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on said Exhibition Grounds, occupying any space thereof, the Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association shall in no manner be responsible; therefore, shall indemnify the said Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association Ltd.

4. ENTRIES

Unless otherwise indicated, all classes in livestock exhibits will be open to all competitors.

- Winter Classic - \$100 per animal/class plus Enviro Fee of \$10.50 per animal
- Registered Cattle - \$70.00 per animal/class plus Enviro Fee of \$10.50 per animal
- Group Classes - \$25.00 per class
- Entry fee covers the cost of the initial bedding of wood chips

CLOSING OF ENTRIES

- **DECEMBER 22, 2021, at 5:00 pm** all entries must be in the office by this time.
- LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UNTIL JANUARY 5, 2022
- LATE ENTRY FEE is **\$100.00** (\$150.00 – WINTER CLASSIC) PER ANIMAL PER CLASS *plus* ENVIRO FEE \$10.50 PER ANIMAL, **SPACE PERMITTING.**

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS (continued)

4. ENTRIES (continued)**ONLINE ENTRIES**

- a) **All entries must be made on online.** Visit www.lloydex.com to enter. If you have any questions or concerns with the online entry system, please don't hesitate to give us a call at 306-825-5571.
- b) Please enter carefully as **OVERPAID** entry fees **will not** be refunded.

REFUSING ENTRIES

- a) The Lloydminster Exhibition Association reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- b) The Director or the President and General Manager, shall be at liberty, for cause, or in the uncontrolled discretion and reason therefore, to bar any exhibitor and/or any animal from participating in, or continuing to participate or compete in any event and may also cause any such animal to be removed from the premises by the Association.

NO REFUNDS of entry fees

Exhibitors making entries and not exhibiting them shall forfeit all entry fees paid

5. **SUBSTITUTIONS** for purebred animals will be allowed up to **January 5, 2022** for a fee of **\$50.00 per substitute**. Substitutions must be same type, and same calendar year. (e.g., January 2021 heifer substituting for as March 2021 heifer; substitution fee will apply).

6. ERRONEOUS ENTRY

Exhibits that have been erroneously entered may, at the discretion of the Committee Chairman, be transferred to the proper classes before judging. If such classes have been judged, they will not be re-judged.

7. ARRIVAL AND RELEASE OF EXHIBITORS

- **Move ONTO Exhibition Grounds: Thursday, January 13, 9:00 AM**
- **All livestock must be in the barn by 9:00 AM on Friday, January 14, 2022 and TIE OUT TIME is at the conclusion of the "Rising Stars Show"**
- **FRIDAY, JANUARY 14, 2022**
 - Original registration papers or online association printed pedigrees must be presented to Committee
 - Pedigrees on cell phones **WILL NOT** be accepted, exhibitors **MUST** have a paper copy of pedigrees
 - Animals that are not registered with the proper association will **NOT** be allowed to show

If you are an exhibitor at this show you are expected to keep your livestock on the grounds until the show is over.

- **RELEASE TIME: SATURDAY, JANUARY 15, 2022 @ 4:00 pm**
- **If you require tie outs for SATURDAY evening, please let office staff know**

EXHIBITORS VIOLATING THE ARRIVAL & RELEASE TIME WILL BE SUBJECT TO A PENALTY AS DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE LLOYDMINSTER AGRICULTURAL EXHIBITION ASSOCIATION LTD. LLOYD EX CATTLEMAN'S CALL COMMITTEE.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS (continued)

8. SHOW NUMBERS

All entries in livestock classes will be printed in the show program, and exhibitors upon entering the ring, must use a number corresponding to the number in the show program, on the back of his/her show harness. The number will be supplied at no cost to the exhibitor.

9. REGISTRATION OF ANIMALS

- a) All animals entered in the breed shows must be of purebred status as recognized by their respective breed association
- b). Entries from Canadian herds must be registered in the recognized Canadian herd book in the name of the exhibitor on the closing date of entries. Entries from non-Canadian herds must be registered in the recognized herd book of their country in the name of the exhibitor as recognized by the Canadian Association on the closing date of entries. Name & number of sire and dam must be given in every case.
- c) Original registration papers must be presented to the committee. Online association printed pedigrees will be accepted for original papers.
- d) Pedigrees on cell phones WILL NOT be accepted, must have a paper copy of pedigrees.

10. HEALTH REGULATIONS

All current health regulations at time of posting, import and export requirements change depending on disease control issues that arise in the country of origin or destination. Please contact your local accredited veterinarian for specific requirements.

11. DISEASED ANIMALS

All animals on the grounds will be subject to veterinary inspection if necessary. No animals having contagious diseases shall be allowed to occupy any stall or building or be admitted to the Exhibition Grounds and if any animal has been admitted through an oversight, suffering from any such disease, the Manager shall immediately order its removal from the grounds.

12. STABLING Exhibitors will be stabled under the supervision of the BARN BOSS.

13. STALLS

- The Association will supply, free of charge, stable room and water for all animals properly entered,
- Exhibitors must supply their own feed troughs and stall cards
- Participating exhibitors may post a sign at their stall of their own production sale
- All exhibitors are required to purchase the straw service from the Lloyd Ex Cattleman's Call Committee

14. PLATFORMS or other build up materials for use in stabling cattle will not be permitted.

15. TIE-OUT TIME on Friday is at the conclusion of the "Rising Star Show" and must return to stall by 8:00 am Saturday.

16. NOSERINGS All bulls over 12 months of age entered in the show **MUST HAVE A NOSE RING (NO HUMBUGS)**, before it will be allowed into the barns, and whenever the animal is moved out of its stall, a nose lead rope must be used.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS (continued)

17. BEDDING AND FEED

- Initial bedding of wood chips will be supplied by LAEA, cost of which is included in the entry fee.
- No further build-up of bedding will be allowed above the initial bedding in place.
- Straw is not allowed in the barns. It will be required that all exhibitors purchase the Straw Service that the Lloydminster Exhibition is providing.
- A supply of shavings and hay will be available for purchase (depending on availability). Hay and shavings can be purchased daily at specified time: 7:30 am – 9:00 am & 7:30 pm – 9:00 pm **ONLY**.

18. MANURE

ALL ALLEYS WILL BE PUSHED BY OUR SKID STEERS AFTER THE SCHEDULED TIE-OUT TIME EACH NIGHT OF THE EVENT. ALL TACK BOXES, TRIMMING CHUTES & OTHER EQUIPMENT MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE PATHS OF THE SKID STEERS BY THE EXHIBITOR. For all other times manure must be placed properly in the containers provided, not piled in alleys or in doorways. **THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

19. CLIPPING AND CLIPPING CHUTES

Clipping or grooming of cattle in the middle aisles of the barns is prohibited, except on the show day of each breed and then it is permitted under the supervision of the Barn Boss.

20. DRESS OF ATTENDANTS

Those showing cattle in the ring must wear clean and tidy clothing. No farm or herd advertising is permitted on exhibitors while showing in the show ring.

21. FRAUDULENT PRACTICES

Any exhibitor who makes a false entry or shall attempt to interfere with, or influence the Officials, while in the discharge of their duties or anyone using contemptuous or abusive language to an official in consequence of awards made, is liable to forfeit his right to all prizes he might otherwise be entitled to and may be excluded from exhibiting at this Exhibition. Officials are particularly requested to immediately report any infraction of this rule.

22. TAMPERING WITH LIVESTOCK

- Unethical fitting of cattle entered for competition is prohibited.
- For this show, unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body such as the introduction of air, liquids or other substances subcutaneously in any part of the body, surgical operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of the animal. Balancing the udder by artificial means.
- Any products/solutions/liquid administered internally to alter the conformation or weight of the animal is prohibited.
- Any animal which, in the opinion of an inspector or inspectors appointed for the purpose, has been unethically fitted shall forthwith be disqualified from exhibition and shall forfeit the right to be awarded any prizes or prize money and entry fees which may have been paid to the Association on account of its entry shall be forfeited. The opinion of the inspector or inspectors and any action which may be taken thereon may be reported to any Association for the registration of purebred livestock of which the exhibitor is a member.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS (continued)

24. DEFINITION OF ENTRY AND OWNERSHIP AS PERTAINING TO SINGLE & GROUP CLASSES

All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one individually or jointly which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are the production of that farm or breeding unit. For the purposes of the classifications, a breeding unit is defined as follows: Where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation, such operations are considered as one breeding unit. In all cases where there is any doubt that more than one breeding unit exists, the interpretation shall be that only one breeding unit exists. The responsibility of proof of separation of breeding units shall rest with the exhibitor(s).

25. HERDSMAN AWARD

Lloyd Ex Cattleman's Call Committee does not offer a Herdsman Award, but permission is given for any breed Association or club to offer a Herdsman Awards for their respective breed exhibitors.

25. JUDGING

- a) No person will be allowed to act as Judge who is in any way interested in the animals that person is to judge.
- b) In the event that the judge exhibits in the purebred show and wins a breed champion, that animal is **ineligible** to be judged in the **Supreme Show** and may parade only.

26. DECISION OF JUDGES

A judge shall have uncontrolled power to decide all questions as to the winner of any event over which such judge presides and the awarding of the prize and the decision of such judge on any such question shall be final and there shall be no recourse therefrom.

Where there is only one exhibitor in any event or where the judge is of the opinion that the animals exhibited do not justify an award, such judge may withhold the awarding of any award for the same or may award prizes according to the standard merited by reason of quality, rather than by reason of number of exhibits.

27. TIME OF SHOWING

The livestock show program will be published and exhibitors are required to act accordingly. Any animals not presented in the ring at the time scheduled will be barred from showing.

28. SHOW RING RULES

No person will be permitted in the cattle ring during the time of judging except the Judge(s) and ring person in charge of the animals, Lloyd Ex Cattleman's Call committee members and official photographer.

29. BREEDING CAPABILITY

In cases where doubt exists in the mind of the judge or officials as to the breeding capability of an animal, the exhibitor thereof maybe required to furnish evidence to the satisfaction of the officials concerned.

30. ALCOHOL IN THE BARN

No alcoholic beverages are to be dispensed or consumed in the alleys of the barn area, there will be a designated area provided for such practises.

31. BARN BOSS

The Barn Boss has complete authority of the stabling of livestock in the barns, allocation of tie-out spaces and control trimming chutes and trimming in the barns. The duties of the Barn Boss are to enforce all barn rules, including cleanliness of barns and aisles and to assist the exhibitors with problems in the barns.
