Master Artisan Program

The MASTER ARTISAN Award will feature the best of the best of the competition. The items chosen to be part of this program are those that require **high skill levels and techniques, unique creative ability and produces Artisan-quality work.**

As the judges complete their judging process they will have the ability to recommend any high-quality workmanship entries to be considered for the Master Artisan program. These recommendations will be reviewed by the committee and finalized as Master Artisan Finalists. This change will allow for any item from any class to be considered and may also see multiple entries from the same category of work. **There will be up to 10 items considered as Finalists and just 1 of those will be named MASTER ARTISAN.**

Please assist judges in better understanding the skills and creative process involved with your item by providing a description on an attached index card. This does not mean you will be chosen, but rather considered by the judges.



HOW TO ENTER: Deadline Thursday, July 4, 2024 at 4:00 pm

- 1) Review the Class categories on the following pages and determine the classes that you would like to enter your creations in. The key rule here is that **YOU MAY ENTER ONLY ONE ITEM PER CLASS PER PERSON.**
- 2) You must use the Entry Form at the end of this package (use additional sheets, if required). These forms should be completed and signed by the exhibitor or a parent/guardian and submitted to the Exhibition Office (along with your entry fees). The entry period is June 1 to July 4 with **ENTRY DEADLINE DATE OF THURS, JULY 4. Actual Items are NOT accepted at the office at the time of registration, they will only be accepted on Drop-Off Day - Monday, July 8 at the Bexson Construction PRAIRIE ROOM down the hall from the Main Office.** We require your entry form and payment in advance so that the committee can prepare for the Drop-Off Day and Judging.
- 3) Entry forms are to be sent to the Exhibition Office together with the required entry fee by the July 4 deadline (your actual items to be shown are NOT accepted/required at this time – they are to be brought on July 8). Entry Fees are as follows:

- 4) When you take your entry form to the Exhibition Office you will be given **Exhibitor Tags** to attach to your items. It is up to the exhibitor to securely fasten the exhibitor's tags with wires, masking tape, safety pins etc. to the article being entered BEFORE bringing it to Drop-Off Day. **NOTE: fasteners must be of neutral and non-identifiable colours – no coloured fasteners please.** If you submit your entry form via fax/mail/email you will not have these tags in advance. Please be prepared to fill out your Exhibitor Tags when you arrive to Drop-Off Day and allow for adequate time to do so.
- 5) Exhibitors who cannot hand-deliver their exhibits may ship them prepaid to the Show Manager. Exhibitors are to notify the Exhibition Office that their entries have been shipped and the expected time of arrival. They should not be sent before June 1.



PREPARING YOUR ITEMS FOR THE COMPETITION:

- 6) No article will be considered by the judges if the Entry Tag is not conspicuously displayed.
- 7) The size of the item must follow the category description (i.e. ½ loaf, 3 buns, etc.).
- 8) **All food exhibits should be displayed and covered in plain plastic bags or wrap on a 6" disposable plate with the tag attached to the PLATE, not the outer covering.**
- 9) **ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR, AND NOT PREVIOUSLY SHOWN.**



DROP-OFF DAY (MONDAY, JULY 8, 2024 from Noon – 7:00 pm):

- 10) You may **drop-off your items from Noon – 7:00 pm on MONDAY, JULY 8, 2024 to the Bexson Construction PRAIRIE ROOMS down the hall from the Main Office**
- 11) Items dropped off late (after 7pm) will not be considered for judging.
- 12) Items need to be properly tagged using the Exhibitor Tags before being checked-in. An area will be set-up for those that need to complete their tags upon arrival.
- 13) Volunteers will be on-hand to accept your items. If there are any changes being made to the items on your entry form, they will be declared at this time. There will be no refunds for items that were entered but not brought to the show.
- 14) Items are Judged on Tuesday, July 9 and put on display for the remainder of the Lloyd Ex Fair. We hope you take the time during the Fair to come and visit all the amazing displays. The Lloyd Ex Fair Creates It: Makers, Bakers & Creators Competition will be open to the public Wednesday through Saturday from 1:00 pm to 8:00 pm.



PICK-UP YOUR ITEMS & PRIZE MONEY:

- 15) Exhibitors have the option to pick up their prize money/items on **Saturday, July 13 from 8:00pm-9:00 pm. Please indicate on your ENTRY FORM** if you would like to do this.
- 16) Alternate pick up days will be Monday, July 15 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm (Bexson Construction Prairie Willow Room) or during regular Exhibition Office Hours Tuesday, July 16 to Friday, July 19 (9am-Noon, 1pm-5pm). **PLEASE NOTE THAT ITEMS NOT PICKED UP BY THE END OF THE DAY ON FRIDAY, JULY 19 WILL BE DISPOSED OF.**



GENERAL SHOW RULES & INFORMATION

- 17) Each entry will be displayed with the other entries in the class, except for finalists in the Master Artisan classes.
- 18) Any baked or perishable exhibits will be disposed of at the Committee's discretion, but prize ribbons and exhibitor's tags will remain on display throughout the Fair.
- 19) There will be security services on the Exhibition Grounds during the event.
- 20) The Directors and Committee members, while taking every precaution, cannot hold themselves responsible for any damage to, or loss of exhibits. Insurance, if required, is the responsibility of the exhibitor with his or her own insurance company.
- 21) Soiled or unfinished articles will be disqualified.**
- 22) Persons entered in or interested in the exhibits will NOT be permitted to judge or be a judge helper.**
- 23) Judges will be selected by the Creates It Competition Committee
- 24) The Judge's decision is final.
- 25) There are no ties in classes.
- 26) Any Exhibitor who makes a false entry, or attempts to interfere with or influence the judges while in the discharge of their duties, or who uses contemptuous or abusive language to a judge in consequences or awards made, is liable to forfeit his/her right to all prizes he/she might otherwise be entitled to, and may be excluded from exhibiting at this Exhibition. Judges are particularly requested to immediately report any infraction of this rule.**
- 27) If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by neglect or wilful act of any person, firm or any corporation, or their agents, representative, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on said Exhibition Grounds, or occupying any space therein, the Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association Ltd., shall be in no way liable.
- 28) The Committee reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations to arbitrarily settle all matters, questions and formal protests in regard thereto.
- 29) Any Exhibitor may be required by the Directors, if the question is raised to make a statutory declaration, that the work exhibited is of their making, and not previously shown at the Lloydminster Exhibition. The Committee reserves the right to disqualify any exhibit suspected of not being the work of the Exhibitor or having previously been shown at the Lloydminster Exhibition if the exhibitor is not present to make the declaration.**

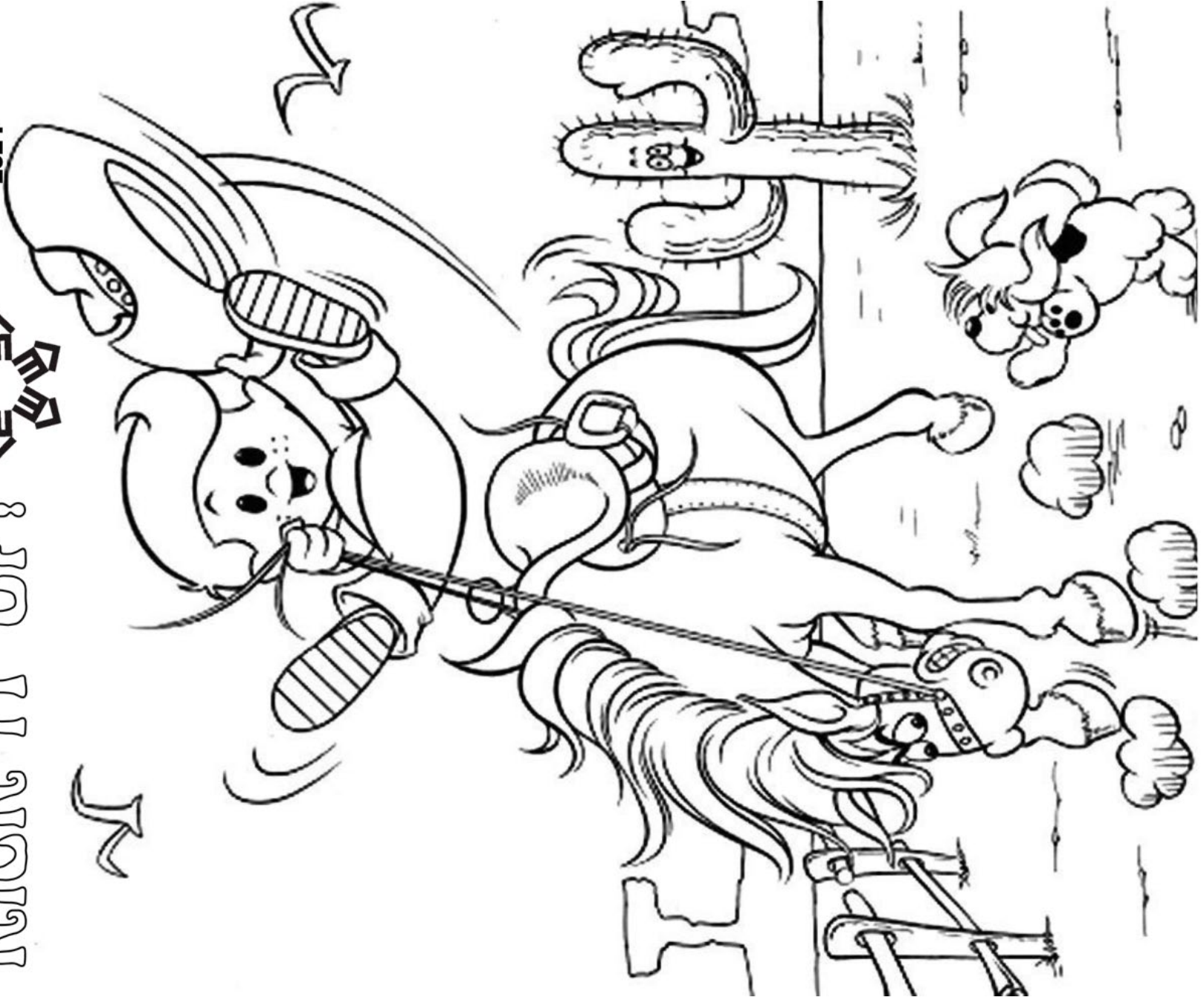

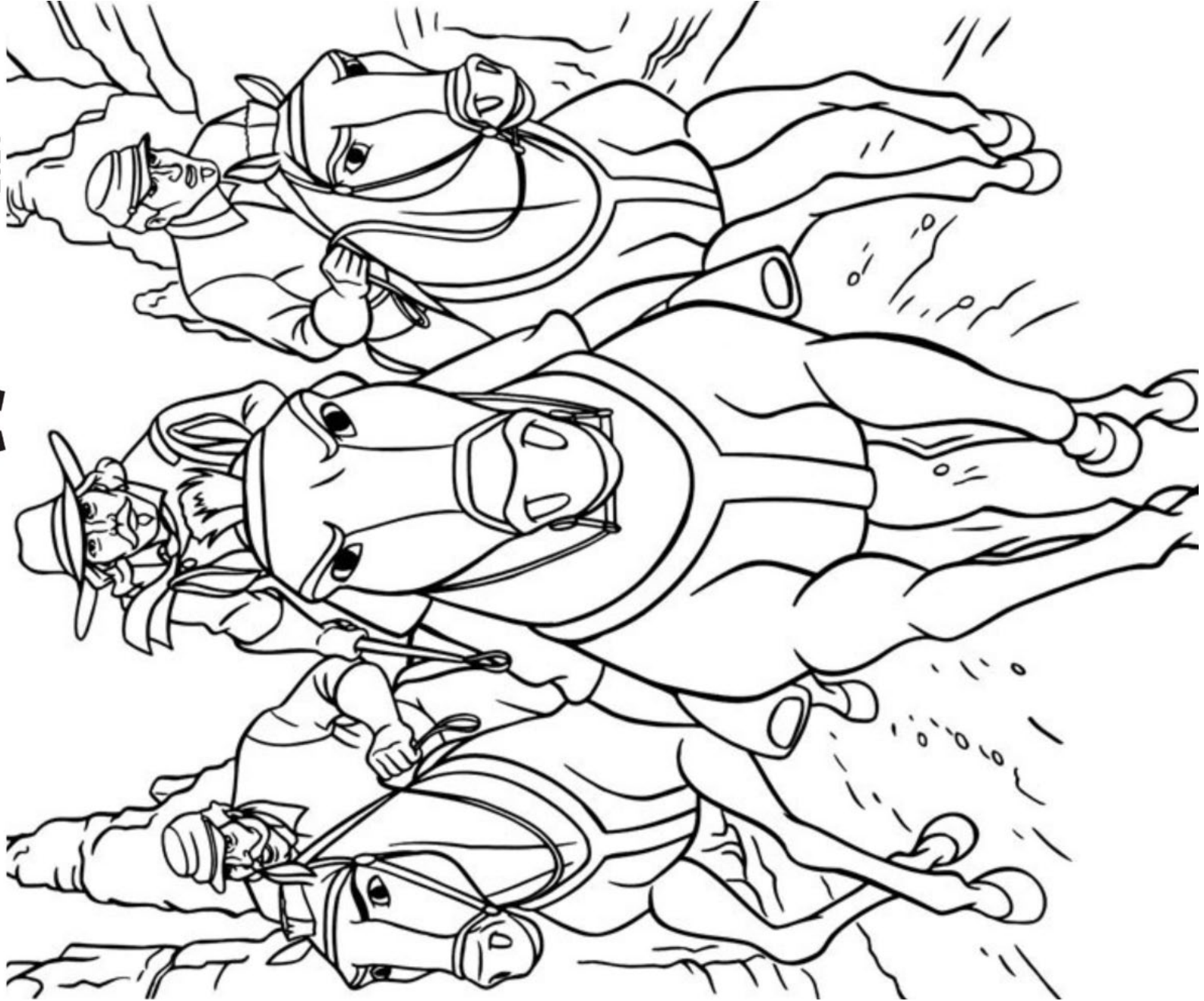
