Information for Angus Gold Show Exhibitors


All animals born from 2012 to 2025 and shown at CAA Gold Shows must be 'Angus' RFID tagged or verified under a CAA program.

Angus RFID Tags and Tattoos will be checked upon arrival at the show. Animals not tagged with Angus RFID tags/verified under an Angus program or with illegible tattoos will be DISQUALIFIED.

The use of any PAINT product is not allowed at Canadian Angus Gold Shows. This rule will be strictly enforced and any animal in violation will be excused from the show.

All Canadian owned or exhibited animals MUST have a Canadian registration paper in order to show. Pending registrations do NOT qualify.

Calves & yearlings, bulls and females to all have 3 divisions
Junior – March & younger
Intermediate – February
Senior – January

## Saskatchewan Junior Angus Gold Show

All entries in the Junior Angus Show are subject to General Rules and Regulations of the Lloydminster Stockade Round-Up. No entry fee if animal is entered in the Angus Gold Show.

#### **Show Rules:**

1. Exhibitors must be 21 years or under as of December 31, 2024, to be eligible to enter. Age splits are as follows: Peewee - 8 years of age & under; Junior - 9 - 12 years of age; Intermediate - 13 -15 years of age and Senior - 16 - 21 years of age.

Exhibitors must be a member of the Canadian Junior Angus Association to be eligible to enter.

Memberships will be collected at the show.

- 2. **Entry Fees**: \$20.00 per animal/class unless animal is also entered in the Gold Show. Plus \$10.00 +.50 GST for Environment Fee per animal, total \$30.50 per animal/class. Fees must accompany entries.
- 3. Females will be shown in two divisions "owned" and "open". All bulls will be shown together in one division.
- 4. Females entered in "open" classes may be owned by anyone but must be shown by the **Junior entrant**.
- 5. Females entered in "owned" classes must be registered in the entrant's name only to be eligible to show.
- 6. Individual animals may only be entered in either the "owned" or "open", not both.
- 7. Animals entered in the Junior Show are eligible to enter and show in their respective classes of the Angus Gold Show.
- 8. The name of the Junior on the entry form must be the <u>same individual</u> who will be on the halter of the animal.
- 9. **Copies of the registration papers <u>must</u> accompany entries** and must be available upon request on show days (electronic printouts are acceptable.)
- 10. All Canadian owned cattle *must* have Canadian Registration Certificates.
- 11. Red & Black Angus show together.
- 12. Calves: May be shown in single classes and as a Cow/Calf unit with their dams. If the calf is a female and becomes Calf or Reserve Calf Champion and as a unit with its dam becomes Senior or Reserve Senior Champion, the exhibitor then will <u>choose</u> which entry will compete for the overall Championship (only one entry is eligible).
- 13. Entries in the **Crossbred Classes** must show Angus breed characteristics.
- 14. **Showmanship**: Showmanship will be judged throughout the conformation classes. Winners will be announced at the end of the show. All Juniors are automatically entered.
- 15. **Judging**: There will be 4 age splits: Peewee, Junior, Intermediate and Senior. On an individual basis, participants will judge one (1) beef class, completing written reasons on the class, on the cards they are given. Peewees and Juniors will be aided by older members if wanted.
- 16. <u>Literature Competition</u>: Original works created by the junior exhibitor. Can be entered in the following categories: (1) Poetry (2) Fiction <3000 words (3) Non-fiction <3000 words. Subject pertaining to Angus cattle, the beef industry, or junior activities. Only one (1) entry per exhibitor.
- 17. **Photography Competition:** Photos must be taken by the junior exhibitor. Only one (1) entry per exhibitor. Can be entered in the following categories: (1) Angus Animal (2) Angus Scenery (3) Angus Animals & People.
- 18. <u>Print Marketing/Graphic Design</u>: This portion of the Competition requires the participant to create an advertisement. Peewees and Juniors will complete their ad by hand at the show with provided supplies and can be on any topic. Intermediates and Seniors will advertise their own genetics and/or a female sale in a computerized format.
- 19. **Team Grooming Competition:** Teams of two will groom an animal.
- 20. The Saskatchewan Junior Angus Association reserves the right to decide on any point not covered by the rules for the proper operation of the show.



#### STOCKADE ROUND-UP GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are requested to familiarize themselves with the following Rules and Regulations governing Stockade Round-Up, as they will be strictly enforced.

#### **VIOLATION OF RULES**

1. All entries for exhibits, shows, sales and displays in the annual show sponsored by Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association are subject to the Rules and Regulations and any violation will subject exhibitors to such penalties the Management Committee may stipulate.

#### **INTERPRETATION**

2. The Board of Directors has the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or in connection with or incident to Stockade Round-Up. The Board of Directors has the right to amend or to add to these Rules and Regulations.

#### **LIABILITY**

- 3. The Board and Committee members, while taking every precaution, cannot hold themselves responsible for any damage to or loss of any exhibit.
- 4. Every exhibitor shall be deemed to be in full charge of and responsible for their exhibit and the Association shall not be liable for any loss to any such exhibits, or for injury or damage thereto from the time that such exhibit commence to be transported to the premises of the Association until such exhibit is delivered there on and every exhibit on such premises shall be deemed to be at the risk of the exhibitor, except in the case of any exhibit being sold, when the same shall remain on such premises at risk of the purchaser at such sale, and in either case the Association shall not be liable for the loss of any such exhibit or for any injury or damage thereto, notwithstanding such loss, injury or damage arising through or by negligence of the Association of any of its officers, servants or agents.
- 5. If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by neglect or willful act of any person, firm or any corporation, or their agents, representative, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on said Exhibition Grounds, occupying any space thereof, the Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association shall in no manner be responsible; therefore, shall indemnify the said Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association Ltd.
- 6. The LAEA ruling on minors showing livestock restricts the age of a minor (determined by the actual age of the minor on the show/event date) showing a bovine or equine, excluding Miniature Horses, unassisted during a Lloyd Ex show/event to a minimum 9 years of age; and that minors between the ages of 6-8 years are permitted to show a bovine or equine but must be chaperoned by an assistant 15 years or age or older.

#### 7. ENTRIES

- a) Supreme Champion Female & Bull of The Show will receive prize money of \$1,000.00 each. All Grand Champions from the Purebred shows at Stockade Round-Up are required to show in the Supreme Champion Show. Princess of the Prairies, Stockade Lady, King of the Ring and Lloyd Ex Junior Show are not eligible to compete.
- b) The number of exhibits permitted in each classification will be as follows: NO RESTRICTION ON MULTIPLE EXHIBITS IN ANY CLASS, excluding Breeder's Herd and Get of Sire.
- c) Unless otherwise indicated, all classes in livestock exhibits will be open to all competitors.

- 8. All cattle entered must have a CCIA ear tag or be tagged with an approved RFID tag.
- 9. Stockade Round-Up Committee will conduct a purebred show for any breed of beef cattle.
- 10. Any breed shows that have less than 15 entries & 3 exhibitors as of the entry closing date, will have the option to be moved to the All Other Breeds Show, or to receive a refund on entry fees, less an administrative fee if the request is made before the entry closing date.
- 11. Premier Breeder & Exhibitor Awards will be awarded to all breeds represented at the show.
- 12. Split Classes: All classes may be split at the discretion of the Committee. Such classes will be split into 2 (or more) equal classes and prize money will be equally split. The Committee will split the class after the animals have arrived at the show premises. First and second placing from each split will compete for the Championships of the division.

#### 13. ENTRY FEES

- 14. <u>CLOSING OF ENTRIES</u>: October 6th, 2025, at 5:00 pm ALL ENTRIES MUST be in the OFFICE by this TIME. LATE ENTRIES WILL be ACCEPTED UNTIL OCTOBER 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025. THE LATE ENTRY FEE is \$100.00 PER ANIMAL PER CLASS *plus* ENVIRO FEE \$10.50 PER ANIMAL, SPACE PERMITTING.

#### 15. ENTRY FORMS

- a) All entries must be completed online. Visit <a href="www.lloydex.com">www.lloydex.com</a> to enter. If you have any questions or concerns with the online entry system, please don't hesitate to give us a call at 306-825-5571.
- b) Please enter carefully as *overpaid* entry fees **will not** be refunded.

#### 16. REFUSING ENTRIES

- a) The Lloydminster Exhibition Association (LAEA) reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- b) The Director or the President and General Manager, shall be at liberty, for cause, or in the uncontrolled discretion and reason therefore, to bar any exhibitor and/or any animal from participating in, or continuing to participate or compete in any event and may also cause any such animal to be removed from the premises by the Association.

#### 17. REFUNDS OF ENTRY FEES

Entry refunds are available until October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

18. **SUBSTITUTIONS**: Substitutions may be made, and they do not have to be type specific; a heifer calf may be substituted for a bull, the originally allotted stall space will remain, regardless of substitutions. *A substitution fee will apply*.

19. **ERRONEOUS ENTRY**: Exhibits that have been erroneously entered may, at the discretion of the Committee Chairman, be transferred to the proper classes before judging. If such classes have been judged, they will not be re-judged. All animals in the barns must be eligible and entered in a show; cattle not entered in show cannot be in the barns or on the Exhibition Grounds.

#### 20. ARRIVAL AND RELEASE OF EXHIBITORS

- a) Move into barns: Monday, October 27th @ 12:00 NOON.
- b) All livestock must be in the barn by 12:00 pm on Tuesday, October 28th, 2025
- c) Release time: Friday, October 31st, 2025, following the Supreme Show.
- d) Absolutely no stall signs or display materials to be taken down prior to 4:00pm.
- e) If you require tie outs Saturday evening, please let the office staff know.



- f) Exhibitors violating the arrival and/or release time will be subject to a penalty of a one-year ban from exhibiting at the Stockade Round-Up or a fine of \$500.00, at the discretion of the Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association Ltd. Stockade Round-Up Show Committee.
- 21. TIE-OUT TIME is after 6:00 pm and must return to stall by 8:00 am.

#### 22. REGISTRATION OF ANIMALS

- a) All animals entered in the breed shows must be of purebred status as recognized by their respective breed association. This pertains to the Lloyd Ex Juniors, Princess of the Prairies, Stockade Lady and King of the Ring Shows.
- b) Entries from Canadian herds must be registered in the recognized Canadian herd book in the name of the exhibitor on the closing date of entries. Entries from non-Canadian herds must be registered in the recognized herd book of their country in the name of the exhibitor as recognized by the Canadian Association on the closing date of entries. Name & number of sire and dam must be given in every case.
- c) Original registration papers must be presented to the committee. Online association printed pedigrees will be accepted for original papers.
- d) Pedigrees on cell phones WILL NOT be accepted.
- e) Registration paper check to take place on Tuesday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025 @ 12:30pm in the Dick Jones Sales Pavilion.

#### 23. SHOW NUMBERS

All entries in livestock classes will be printed in the show program, and exhibitors upon entering the ring, must use a number corresponding to the number in the show program, on the back of his/her show harness. The number will be supplied at no cost to the exhibitor.

#### 24. **HEALTH REGULATIONS**

All current health regulations at time of posting, import and export requirements change depending on disease control issues that arise in the country of origin or destination. Please contact your local accredited veterinarian for specific requirements.

#### 25. **DISEASED ANIMALS**

All animals on the grounds will be subject to veterinary inspection if necessary. No animals having contagious diseases shall be allowed to occupy any stall or building or be admitted to the Exhibition Grounds and if any animal has been admitted through an oversight, suffering from any such disease, the Manager shall immediately order its removal from the grounds.

#### 26. STALLING

- a) Exhibitors will be stalled under the supervision of their respective breed Barn Boss.
- b) The Association will supply, free of charge, stall room and water for all animals properly entered.
- c) No feed troughs will be supplied.
- d) Exhibitors are required to display their own stall cards.
- e) Participating exhibitors may post a sign at their stall of their own production sale.
- f) All exhibitors are required to purchase the straw service from the Stockade Round-Up Show Committee.
- 27. PLATFORMS or other build up materials for use in stabling cattle will not be permitted.
- 28. Any bull over 12 months of age entered in the show **MUST HAVE A NOSE RING** (NO HUMBUGS), before it will be allowed into the barns, and whenever the animal is moved out of its stall, a nose lead rope must be used.

#### 29. **BEDDING AND FEED**

- a) Initial bedding of wood chips will be supplied by LAEA, cost of which is included in the entry fee.
- b) No further build-up of bedding will be allowed above the initial bedding in place
- c) Straw is not allowed in the barns. It will be required that all exhibitors purchase the Straw Service that the Lloydminster Exhibition is providing.
- d) A supply of shavings will be available for purchase (depending on availability).

#### 30. MANURE

All alleys will be pushed by our skid steers after the scheduled tie-out time each night of the event. All tack boxes, trimming chutes & other equipment must be removed from the paths of the skid steers by the exhibitor. For all other times manure must be placed in designated areas, not piled in alleys or in doorways. **THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.** 

#### 31. CLIPPING AND CLIPPING CHUTES

Clipping or grooming of cattle in the middle aisles of the barns is prohibited, except on the show day of each breed and then it is permitted under the supervision of the Barn Boss.

#### 32. DRESS OF ATTENDANTS

Those showing cattle in the ring must wear clean and tidy clothing. No farm or herd advertising is permitted on exhibitors while showing in the show ring.

#### 33. FRAUDULENT PRACTICES

Any exhibitor who makes a false entry or shall attempt to interfere with, or influence the Officials, while in the discharge of their duties or anyone using contemptuous or abusive language to an official in consequence of awards made, is liable to forfeit his right to all prizes he might otherwise be entitled to and may be excluded from exhibiting at this Exhibition. Officials are particularly requested to immediately report any infraction of this rule.

#### 34. TAMPERING WITH LIVESTOCK

- a) Unethical fitting of cattle entered for competition is prohibited.
- b) For this show, unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body such as the introduction of air, liquids or other substances subcutaneously in any part of the body, surgical operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of the animal. Balancing the udder by artificial means.
- c) Any products/solutions/liquid administered internally to alter the conformation or weight of the animal is prohibited.
- d) Any animal which, in the opinion of an inspector or inspectors appointed for the purpose, has been unethically fitted shall forthwith be disqualified from exhibition and shall forfeit the right to be awarded any prizes or prize money and entry fees which may have been paid to the Association on account of its entry shall be forfeited. The opinion of the inspector or inspectors and any action which may be taken thereon may be reported to any Association for the registration of purebred livestock of which the exhibitor is a member.

## 35. <u>DEFINITION OF ENTRY AND OWNERSHIP AS PERTAINING TO SINGLE & GROUP</u> CLASSES

- a) All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one individually or jointly which are maintained on ONE FARM or BREEDING UNIT, are the production of THAT FARM OR BREEDING UNIT.
- b) BREEDING UNIT is defined as follows: Where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation, such operations are considered as ONE BREEDING UNIT.
- c) In all cases where there is any doubt that more than one breeding unit exists, the interpretation shall be that ONLY ONE BREEDING UNIT EXISTS. The responsibility of proof of separation of breeding units shall rest with the exhibitor(s).
- 36. PREMIER BREEDER PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARDS \*to MAX of 36 points

  Awards will be based on points awarded to the first top six places in the single breeding classes on the following basis:

 $1^{\text{st}} - 6 \text{ points}$   $4^{\text{th}} - 3 \text{ points}$   $2^{\text{nd}} - 5 \text{ points}$   $5^{\text{th}} - 2 \text{ points}$   $3^{\text{rd}} - 4 \text{ points}$   $6^{\text{th}} - 1 \text{ point}$ 

In the event of a tie, the exhibitor with the highest placing in the Breeders Herd Class will be declared the winner.

**PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD** – points will be awarded to the Breeding Unit from which the animal is exhibited. Premier Exhibitor – points will be awarded to the show string exhibit (breeding unit) from which the animals are exhibited in single classes. Thus, animals owned through partnership or among family members can contribute points towards the Premier Exhibitor Award. *Fitting Services are not eligible*.

**PREMIER BREEDER AWARD** - Points for this award go to the registered breeder's unit for animals shown in single classes. *To be eligible for this award, the breeder must exhibit at the show*. Joint breeders will be considered separate entities. In the case of jointly bred exhibits, the tattoo prefix of the exhibit will be followed in awarding the points. A breed representative from each breed will be responsible for the tabulation of the Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor points.

**NOTE:** In cases where an animal(s) is jointly owned, the person submitting the entry form must indicate in the space provided, which owner should receive the points for <u>Premier Exhibitor</u> or <u>Premier Breeder</u> with respect to an animal. If not indicated we will place the points to the first name listed on the registration paper, the Committee's decision on this matter will be final.

#### 37. HERDSMAN AWARD

Stockade Round-Up Committee does not offer a Herdsman Award, but permission is given for any breed Association or club to offer a Herdsman Award for their respective breed exhibitors.

#### 38. JUDGING

- a) No person will be allowed to act as Judge who is in any way interested in the animals that person is to judge.
- b) In the event that the judge exhibits in the purebred show and wins a breed champion, that animal is ineligible to be judged in the Supreme Show and may parade only.

#### 39. DECISION OF JUDGES

A judge shall have uncontrolled power to decide all questions as to the winner of any event over which such judge presides and the awarding of the prize and the decision of such judge on any such question shall be final and there shall be no recourse therefrom.

Where there is only one exhibitor in any event or where the judge is of the opinion that the animals exhibited do not justify an award, such judge may withhold the awarding of any award for the same or may award prizes according to the standard merited by reason of quality, rather than by reason of number of exhibits.

#### 40. TIME OF SHOWING

The livestock show program will be published and exhibitors are required to act accordingly. Any animals not presented in the ring at the time scheduled will be barred from showing.

#### 41. SHOW RING RULES

No person will be permitted in the cattle ring during the time of Judging except the Judge(s) and ring person in charge of the animals, Stockade Round-Up committee members and official photographer.

#### 42. BREEDING CAPABILITY

In cases where doubt exists in the mind of the judge or officials as to the breeding capability of an animal, the exhibitor thereof may be required to furnish evidence to the satisfaction of the officials concerned.

43. <u>ALCOHOL IN THE BARN</u> No alcoholic beverages are to be dispensed or consumed in the alleys of the barn area, there will be a designated area provided for such practices.

#### 44. BARN SUPERINTENDENT AND BREED BARN BOSSES

The Barn Superintendent has complete authority of the stalling of livestock in the barns, allocation of tie-out spaces and control trimming chutes and trimming in the barns. The duties of the Barn Boss are to enforce all barn rules, including cleanliness of barns and aisles and to assist the exhibitors with problems in the barns.
