Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Waiver Agreement

For good and valuable consideration, including permission to participate in "The Running with the Bulls" Event at Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association grounds, Lloydminster, Alberta/Saskatchewan, Canada, I, myself, my successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, spouse and next of kin:

1. Agree that prior to participating in the "Wild West Activities" Events I will inspect the facilities, equipment and areas to be used, and if I believe any of them are unsafe, I will immediately advise the person supervising the events, activity, facility or area;
2. Acknowledge that I fully understand that my participation involves risk of serious injury or death and economic losses which may result from my own actions, inactions or the negligence of others, or from the condition of the facilities, equipment, or areas where the Event or activities being conducted, as well as the rules of play for this type of Event or activity;
3. Assume any and all risks of bodily injury to myself, including medical or hospital bills, permanent or partial disability, death, dismemberment and damages to my property, caused by or arising from my participation in the Event or activity;
4. Agree not to sue, or present any claim for personal injury, property damage, or wrongful death against The Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association, sponsors, or their affiliated companies, employees, guests, agents, sponsors, or assigns for damages attributable to my participation in the Event or activity;
5. Discharge and release The Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association, employees, guests, agents, sponsors, and assigns from any liability, loss, damage, claim, demand or cause of action against them arising from or attributed to my participation in the Event or activity, whether same shall arise by their negligence or other wise;
6. Agree that photographs, pictures, slides, movies or videos of me may be taken in connection with my participation in the Event or activity by Lloydminster Agricultural Exhibition Association and consent to the use of these photographs, pictures, slides, movies or videos for any legal purpose without notice or compensation of any kind to me;

Wild West Activities Rules & Regulations

Calf Scramble:

- 1) All calves will have a ribbon attached to their body
- 2) The Calf Scramble will be referred by an appointed group of judges
- 3) Participants and calves will be placed in the arena as directed by the arena director
- 4) Participants will not take anything into the arena
- 5) Each participant will attempt to get the ribbon off of the calf
- 6) Undue roughness will not be tolerated by the judges. Any unsportsmanlike conduct automatically disqualifies any participant
 - a. No tackling, wrestling, grabbing or pulling on the calves
- 7) When the buzzer goes, the participants have to remove as many of the ribbons as they can
- 8) The participant with the most amount of ribbons wins the event
- 9) Shoes with any type of cleat will not be permitted in the arena

Wild Pony Races:

- 1) Team of 3 are needed per pony, teams can be composed of participants aged 6-12
- 2) Ponies will be processed safely in the chute before each team enters the arena
- 3) Participants must wear provided protective equipment
 - a. Failure to do so will result in the participant to not be able to participate
- 4) Teams will go one at a time
- 5) The participants will hold on to the lead shank, the pony will be let out of the chute and the contestants must try to get their rider on the pony as fast as they can within the 2-minute timer
- 6) If the rider is successful in getting on the pony, the rider must stay on for 2 hops
 - a. Hops will be determined by the Judges
- 7) There will be no verbal or physical abuse tolerated towards to judge
- 8) In the event that all of the participants let the pony go, their attempt is over, however if one or two participants are still holding on to the lead shank, the other participant(s) are able to continue to help get the rider on the pony
- 9) If the team does not successfully get the rider on the pony before the buzzer goes off, the team is disqualified
- 10) Teams who successfully get the rider on the pony for two hops, win
 - a. In the case of there is more than one team who was successful, the winner will be the team who completed the task the fastest
